Cross Creek lost a good man when Bill Neland was called home last month. Bill's fight with cancer was fast. He had severe pain at work, went to get help and by the end of the day he landed in North Kansas City Hospital's heart floor. Tests were ordered and soon discovered that Bill had esophageal cancer. Those words can take the wind out of your sails and that's what happened to Bill. He had great care at NKC Hospital and hated to leave there but was sent home. He had a feeding tube placed and learned the art of self-feeding. His instructor was Sue Ashley, retired RN. She went far beyond just teaching Bill to feed with the tube. Home less than a week, Bill was taken by ambulance to St. Luke's East where they discovered the severity of his illness. He was advised his best option was hospice given the circumstances. Bill's sister, Cindy, was informed that it was time for hospice to take over so he was moved back to North Kansas City Hospice House where he lived most of a day.

That was Bill's ending, but not his life. Vickie and I met Bill in 2000 when he cooked at Sandy's Restaurant, then close to the church in Grain Valley. It took years for us to build a strong relationship as Bill often moved seeking work. Eventually Bill settled back in our area and he began attending Cross Creek and became a longtime member. Seldom have I seen a life transformed as Bill's. Bill read the Word of God faithfully morning and night. He watched old Billy Graham Crusade preaching on TV. He loved Christian music and loved listening to our Praise Team worship on Sunday. Bill believed that everything in his possession actually belonged to God and it was just on loan to him. That's why Bill called everything he had God's; he drove God's van then God's SUV. He had God's banking account. He lived in God's apartment. He managed God's money and gave God's money in the offering plate. If he ever missed a Sunday,

Guard Your Joy - It Is Worth Protecting by *Chrissy Kirkman*

The sooner we can realize that our joy doesn't just happen to us, the more joy we will experience.

Inherently, it is ours as believers. It is a gift straight from our Father's hands, rooted in the unwavering love and incomprehensible grace He pours over us with every breath that we have.

Really, joy is Jesus. He is it, personified. We never have to earn it; however, we do have to keep it. Guard it. Be alert of what tries to take it from our hands.

The enemy would love nothing more than to try to stake his territory and replace what we are "drinking". With the perfect mix— a little stress, some unnecessary anxiety, a sliver of comparison, and a teaspoon of fear, he can have us swirling into the throws of our future and completely unavailable to the present moment.

And here's the thing- we frequently hear the phrase, "choose joy!" And YES! But if we don't realize the thieves that are hoping to hijack it, our hearts will not sound off the alarms when the walls need to go up, the sirens need to blare, and we need the perfect truth of God to dispel whatever is trying to take our joy.

Something can be heavy and we can still choose to carry it lightly. Something can be unknown and unprecedented and we can still decide fear or anxiety isn't necessary. What might be trying to steal your joy today? Do you feel like you've already passed it off?

Take it back. It's okay, it has your name on it.

Then guard it. Fiercely. Offer it to as many people as possible and it will multiply. Proclaim it, stand on it, and exercise it in all that you do. When we operate in this radical joy frequently, we don't have to worry about it being stolen, as it realizes that it comes from abiding in the palm of His hands. 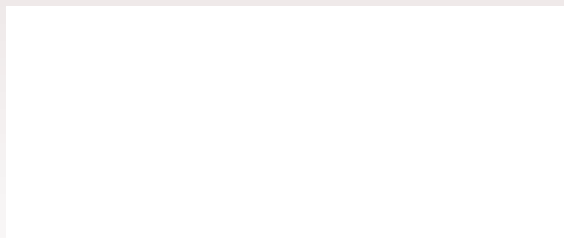
