

Matthew 7:7 (NIV)

Worry never solves a thing. If something is big enough to worry about, it is big enough to pray about. Prayer opens the door for God to grow your trust.

Jesus reminds us in Luke 11:13 that if imperfect parents know how to give good gifts, our heavenly Father delights to give even better gifts to those who ask.



God grows trust through a simple rhythm.

You notice a need.

Your faith deepens.

So today, pause for a moment.

Name your need.

These are not passive words. They are invitations to step toward God.

- To ask is to come with honesty.

Each verb invites you to engage with the God who loves you, sees you, and responds with perfect wisdom and perfect timing. What could be better than that?

As we step into 2026 with this theme before us, we can look ahead with confidence because God meets every movement toward Him with mercy, wisdom, and faithful care. He will not fail you, and He will continue to show Himself strong as you Ask, Seek, and Knock in the year ahead.
