Prayer Is Talking with God

Jesus gathered His disciples and followers on the side of a mountain and taught them about God's Kingdom. We call this His Sermon on the Mount. Jesus talked about the blessings of God's Kingdom - the beatitudes, about loving others, and then He spoke about prayer.

Prayer is simply talking with God. We can talk to God at anytime and anywhere; He is always listening.

Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you" (Matt. 7:7). Notice the Lord doesn't say "maybe it will be given," "perhaps you will find," or "hopefully it'll be opened."

And when we walk through this open door, it is through faith in Christ on the path of salvation that He alone provides.

When you ask, ask for more of Jesus. When you seek, seek the path of Jesus. And when you knock, knock boldly in the certainty that Jesus will open Himself to you and welcome you home.
