The fence is up and completed. Some donations have been made so far but we still have 3300 dollars yet to raise in order pay back the account from which we borrowed the money. So please make a generous donation marked 'Fence' on your envelope. In case you're wondering, yes, I was the first one to make a sacrificial gift toward the fence project. It will get competed because together we'll make it happen. Thanks in advance.

Election Day is close and there is a frightening amendment on the ballot and Missourians should be informed of its potential. Amendment 3 is asking you to vote to legalize recreational marijuana and it's dangerous for all Missouri. What I'm sharing is only the tip of the iceberg; room doesn't allow more. The Missouri Association of Prosecuting Attorneys, are warning us about Amendment 3. They strongly oppose it. There's a long list of protections for those being prosecuted or on parole or out on bail. Even if they kill your son or daughter or grandchildren they are protected. The courts cannot prohibit them from using marijuana. This is insane. In Colorado, recreational marijuana was legalized and they saw a 138% increase in traffic fatalities where the driver tested positive for marijuana. What is wrong with law makers? Amendment 3 makes drugged driving tougher to prosecute than someone driving drunk. Amendment 3 is more than 30 pages of rules and regulations on everything from licensing to taxes. The MO Constitution is only about 120 pages long. Should legalizing recreational marijuana occupy almost a fifth of our Constitution? If it passes and we then decide it was a bad decision it'll cost taxpayers millions to fix it. Just today, Vickie and I had a long conversation with our doctor about this and he said they have used the medical field to introduce smoking pot as a healing drug. He's not buying it and had plenty to say about the proven dangers of smoking marijuana. No matter how good it may feel, it's not good.
